Who's it for?


Your entire school will feel supported through this multi-pronged approach to best-practice drug education.

Learning outcomes

We recommend a combination of student, teacher, and parent sessions to ensure consistent knowledge and understanding of alcohol and other drugs across your school community. Sessions can be delivered within one term or spread across the school year.



Up to 1 Hour



Classroom Sessions

Who's it for?

All students can access age-appropriate alcohol and other drug education, from grade 5 through to university.

Learning outcomes

Our small-group interactive classroom sessions provide young people with opportunities to engage, interact, ask questions and learn about the risks and potential harms caused by alcohol and other drugs.

What Works in Drug Education

Who's it for?

Designed with principals, teachers, and school health nurses in mind, this training increases capacity for independent delivery of alcohol and other drug education.

Learning outcomes

These sessions help to achieve a unified approach to alcohol and other drug education by building upon existing knowledge.

Responding to Drug and Alcohol Use

Who's it for?


This workshop will help teachers to understand why some young people may feel a reluctance or lack of motivation to change their health-related behaviours.

Learning outcomes

This workshop will provide some basic health messaging and conversational prompts that teachers can use with students when discussing alcohol and other drugs. It provides teachers with the information and resources they need to respond to questions, concerns or conversations with students.

Parent Forums

Who's it for?

Hosting a forum for parents, carers and guardians is a great way to ensure that the whole school community has access to the information that they need to help keep young people safe from drug-related harm.

Learning outcomes

A parent forum will help to alleviate carer's concerns and knowledge gaps by sharing up-to-date information and resources, and identifying avenues where further supports can be accessed.

Booking Sessions

School community sessions are available to all public, private and independent schools and colleges located across Tasmania.

Our sessions are offered to students from grade five and are popular in schools across all age ranges, so our calendar can fill quickly.
