Who's it for?

This workshop is suitable for all employees, volunteers or program participants at any level within your workplace or organisation.

Learning outcomes

Participants will leave with an understanding of factors associated with alcohol and other drugs including:

- How drugs affect the human body.
- Employee and employer responsibilities in reducing risks and harms.
- Where to access support and further information.



Alcohol and Other Drug Workshops

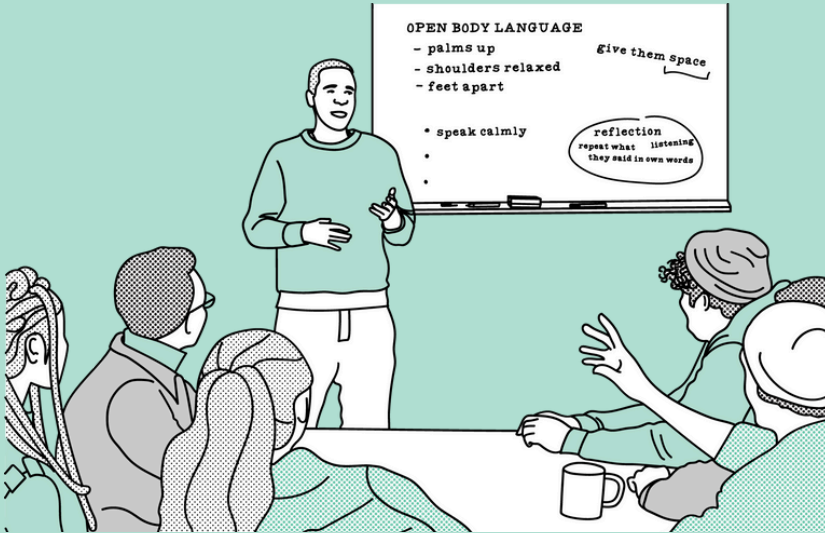
Who's it for?

This workshop is suitable for anyone over the age of 18 looking to increase their knowledge of alcohol and other drugs.

Learning outcomes

Participants will leave with an increased understanding of alcohol and other drugs including:

- Drug use effects and risks.
- Drug use patterns in the Tasmanian context.
- Where to find support and further information.



Responding to Challenging Behaviours

Who's it for?

This workshop is intended for organisations that want to assess and improve their response to client behaviours influenced by alcohol and drug use and review internal procedures to ensure the safety of all individuals involved.

Learning outcomes

Participants will leave with increased knowledge of drugs and alcohol specific to:

- The underlying causes of challenging behaviours related to alcohol and other drug use.
- Increased knowledge of de-escalation techniques and safety considerations within the scope of their service.
- Increased understanding of factors in their service which may contribute to escalation of challenging behaviours.
- Where to find support and further information.



Brief Intervention Foundation

Who's it for?

This training is suitable for all employees and volunteers working in client-facing roles looking to increase their skills in supporting clients around health behaviour change.

Learning outcomes

Participants will leave with:

- Increased understanding of what a brief intervention is and why they are used.
- Increased knowledge of the Stages of Change theory and how it applied to people using alcohol and other drugs.
- Increased skills and confidence providing Brief Interventions.



Brief Intervention Masterclass

Who's it for?

This masterclass is suitable for anyone who has already completed the Brief Intervention Foundation training or has a current working knowledge of the Stages of Change.

Learning outcomes

Participants will leave with an:

- Increased understanding of how to target interventions to the different stages of change.
- Increased understanding of the processes that underpin health behaviour change
- Facilitated reflection on the strengths and areas for improvement in their current workplace practices.

Allow us to inform and empower your audience by inviting us to speak at your forum, conference or event.


